Essential Question:

How can we assist Middle School students to understand the history of our town, and help create a permanent record of it for future generations?

Introduction:

Middle school students at Forest Hills Consolidated School, Jackman, Maine will collaborate with the Jackman-Moose River Historical Society to create graphic and audio visual records of the history of our community which will be made available to the public.

Project Goals:

By June 2006, students will present to the Jackman-Moose River Historical Society Museum approximately 30 digital story telling and graphic projects which will be placed on display for public educational use. To accomplish these goals students will pair up and research an artifact, building, cemetery or site of historical significance, or interview a longtime resident. The results of this research will be put into approximately 30 audiographic DVD's or CD's.

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
